2.	Heart Failure Registry	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There was a positive response from the group to enhance engagement in the HF registry. Helen has slides which she is happy to share with anyone that wants to present to their DHB, please let her know via email. helenmc@adhb.govt.nz. We have resubmitted an application for funding to improve and update the registry. We are still waiting on outcome. 	
3.	CSANZ Website	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> At our previous meeting it was suggested that we have somewhere we could share information and educational tools. This will now be available on our designated web page through CSANZ which James has started and can be accessed via web. However, it has some difficulties which are being worked on. Please try to access and give comments on same. It is password protected thus enabling us to have email addresses and educational information available to access. 	
4.	Ivabradine	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The EP working group has asked us if we would put together a supporting letter to Pharmac for use of Ivabradine in our patients with heart failure who cannot tolerate a beta blocker.) Rob Doughty suggested that we need to create a need and present a proposal from the HWG Rob Doughty and Raewyn Fisher have agreed to draft letter for support. (please approach Servia –used off label) 	

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5.	Other Business	<p>Helen proposed a repeat HF questionnaire update. Last done 2009. The data presented enabled Dr Tammy Pegg to put forward a proposal to Nelson DHB to secure funding for HF nurses. Rob Doughty suggested that we include in the update Primary care nurses. Wendy Bryson suggested that we do an in-depth investigation of a specific topic, she also reported that she had contact in PHO primary Nurses and would talk with them as how best we could get a response from their group. The questionnaire will have to be relooked at and updated.</p> <p>We then had a brief round the room of what is happening in each DHB present.</p> <p>Tammy Pegg Nelson DHB: They were successful in securing funding for Primary health care nurse where her key role is to integrate primary and secondary care, telephone follow up and introduction of ACP</p> <p>Janet Dunbar Wellington DHB: 2 FTE, They have an exercise programme for HF patients and are much more collegial.</p> <p>Raewyn Fisher Waikato DHB: They have 6 CNS to cover the whole of the DHB. They provide secondary care and work in 6 GP practices, up skilling PN's.</p> <p>Wendy Bryson Bay Of Plenty DHB: They are in the process of getting a second Nurse Practitioner to enable them to move out into the community. Their service now includes ICD clinics. Wendy highlighted the importance of succession planning.</p> <p>Maria Kleintyes Hutt Valley DHB: The loss of Mona from their team was acknowledged. They are looking at restricting the service and integrating HF and CR. They currently provide an exercise programme to their HF patients. They are having difficulties providing HF management to primary care due to funding issues. They are keen to address ways to improve the care of end stage HF to their patient group.</p> <p>Lia Sinclair Mid Central DHB: They are having problems with engaging primary and PHO services.</p> <p>Kristen Willock Gisborne DHB: They now have congenital clinics back in Gisborne their FTE has increased from 0.4 to 1.0. They currently have 2 clinics per week and 2 GP/week</p> <p>Kelly Grant Southland DHB: They do not have any FTE for HF. They provide a cardiac rehab exercise programme and home visits.</p> <p>Mary Molloy Southland DHB (Dunedin): They have 1 clinic</p> <p>June Poole Counties Manakau DHB: 2 NP and 4 NS who provide HF and Cardiac rehabilitation. Their aim is to improve early diagnosis; they have a community exercise programme. They have</p>

They are working on NP development, succession planning and increase compliance with HF registry.</p> <p>Suzanne Jackson South Canterbury DHB: They have 1 FTE for Cardiac rehab and chronic disease management. They have an elderly population and good working relationships with GP in the area.</p> <p>There was a request for an updated list of members. Janet Dunbar circulated a list last year.
